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Holograms seem to satisfy children's fascination with eerie things. At the Museum of Holography (1134 W. Washington Blvd., 226-1007) they gaped for a long time in front of the hologram of a werewolf and a 2,000-year-old Lindow man found in a peat bog in England. Like all museum stores,

the Museum of Holography sells inexpensive gadgets that prolong the children's pleasure. Our 6-year-old got a pair of glasses that was a mere band of black plastic with slits for lenses that broke up light into a rainbow of colors. The city seen through them was even better the second time around.

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
